For some holiday relief, make your way to Trinity Cathedral on Sunday, November 28 at 5 PM for a Bluegrass Concert with the Clear Fork Bluegrass Quartet. The concert is free of charge; adjacent lighted parking is available off Prospect.

Founded in 1984, the Clear Fork Bluegrass Quartet combines the drive and melodies of Celtic fiddle tunes as played in the Appalachian Mountains, African-American Blues and Baptist Gospel harmonies. The musicians perform on fiddle, acoustic bass, guitar, mandolin, banjo and vocals, and draw on multiple sources of traditional American music of inspiration.

Their fresh, electric style has been heard on Garrison Keillor's "American Radio Company" program, West Virginia Public Radio's "Mountain Stage" and several other radio programs. From fiery banjo instrumentals to sweet country waltzes, Clear Fork takes great pride in their ability to make bluegrass an enjoyable experience for people of all ages.
