## JESUS, PAUL, SEX, AND POWER: A SEMINAR

CLEVELAND—On Friday, October 29 and Saturday, October 30, the Jesus Seminar on the Road will visit Trinity Cathedral, 2230 Euclid Avenue in downtown Cleveland, for a program titled *Jesus, Paul, Sex, and Power*. The Jesus Seminar, an ongoing academic project, examines historical evidence about Jesus and early Christian communities.

At the Trinity seminar, two Jesus Seminar scholars will discuss what the historical figures of Jesus and Paul said about gender and sexuality and how their words can be interpreted in light of first-century Palestine's culture. On Friday, October 29 from 7:30 PM-9 PM, there will be a lecture titled *From Jesus to Constantine and Back: Footsteps and Missteps in Gender and Sexuality*. On Saturday from 9:30 AM- 2:30 PM, the topic of two workshops will be *Cracks in the Pyramids of Power: Jesus* (morning topic) and *Paul* (afternoon topic).

Kathleen Corley and Arthur Dewey will present the lecture and workshops. Corley is Oshkosh Northwestern Professor and Professor of New Testament at the University of Wisconsin—Oshkosh. She is most recently the co-editor of *Jesus and Mel Gibson's The Passion of the Christ: The Film, the Gospels, and the Claims of History*. Dewey is Professor of Theology, Xavier University. He is co-founder of the "Healing Deadly Memories Program," a project that conducts workshops on dealing with anti-Semitism in the New Testament.

The cost for the Friday evening lecture and both Saturday workshops is \$50. The cost of the Friday evening lecture only is \$10. Each Saturday workshop, morning and afternoon, is \$25. Lunch on Saturday is \$6 when ordered from Café Ah-Roma at Trinity Cathedral (call 216-774-0414 by October 27), or participants may bring their own lunches.
