

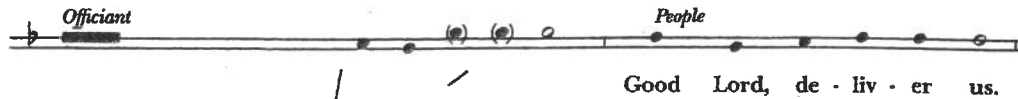

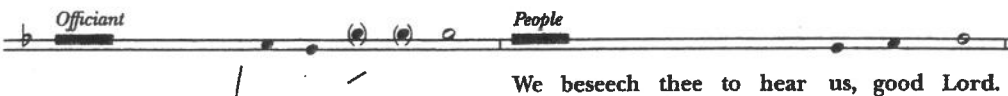
From lightning and tempest; from earthquake, fire, and flood; from plague, pestil-/ence, and famine,
