Recently my wife and I revised our wills.

There had been some changes in our family, and we had not actually made any changes when first moving to Ohio, so we knew it was time to update our plans to make sure that our wishes for our children and for our wider family and causes that are near to our heart would be understood and honored.



A will is more than just a financial document: it's a way to care for those we leave behind. When we make our wishes clear (and ready to be carried out legally) we can provide a great deal of comfort to our families, who will then be able to focus more on grief and healing than on discerning our likely or possible wishes . . .

Youth Confirmation Class Begins Sept. 17 for Youth in Seventh - Ninth Grade

Confirmation is the sacramental rite in which candidates "express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop." (Book of Common Prayer, p. 860). Incoming seventh through ninth graders can join confirmation classes this fall.

Classes will take place one a month, beginning on Sunday, September 17 from 1–2:30 p.m. in the Youth & Family Center on Trinity's third floor. Classes will continue on the third Sunday
