Without Shame or Fear

Can you imagine living your life without shame or fear? It seems like so much of our public life is rooted in shame. Brené Brown, a New York Times Bestselling author, professor, and CEO of "The Daring Way", makes a distinction between guilt and shame. She distinguishes, "guilt is what we feel when we think we've done something bad, shame is what we feel when made to think that we are bad." Shame is corrosive and hurtful, and very rarely leads to transformed behavior. Indeed, more often than not shame leads to greater disfunction as someone begins to act out of shame rather than hope or self-compassion...




The Philadelphia Eleven 50th Anniversary Film Screening


Bible Study
