The Dean's Corner: Love That Heals All Wounds

When I say love, you can translate that into "life with God". To me, love is where the temporal and the eternal meet.

- Becca Stevens, Practically Divine

The Rev. Becca Stevens has spent her life exploring that sacred tension point where the temporal and eternal meet and found it to be what we think of as *love*. Yet, she hasn't simply touched on that in sermons or theological inquiry; she has found evidence of that love in some most challenging and tender places, especially where women have emerged from lives of exploitation, addiction, trafficking, and extreme poverty. Miraculously, she has found this love – where the grace of the eternal meets the flesh-andbone-reality – to be an infinite source of healing and renewal.

From Dean Owens, "Nearly three decades ago, the Rev. Becca Stevens opened a home for five women survivors of trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. In making this commitment, she quickly recognized that financial self-sufficiency was instrumental to their recovery, yet they could not find work because of their history. In search of a solution, she and a number of volunteers began making candles in a church basement. From that basement initiative, Thistle Farms social enterprises were born." (Read the full story).

Thistle Farms is widely known for its social enterprises that help women survivors overcome and heal from systems of prostitution and exploitation. 
The acclaimed performer will play the music of Scriabin and Rachmaninoff.



A Conversation with Dr. Gretchen Sisson, Ph.D. Relinquished: The Politics of Adoption and the Privilege of

American Motherhood, October 30, 7:30 - 8:30 p.m., Virtual

In a political moment in Ohio where adoption is often invoked as an abortion alternative, what can we learn from the experiences of women who have relinquished children for adoption? <u>Adoption Network Cleveland</u> is pleased to host sociologist Gretchen Sisson, Ph.D. for a special preview of her upcoming book, *Relinquished: The Politics of Adoption and the Privilege of American Motherhood (Macmillian, February 2024)*, and Trinity Cathedral is proud to be a partner in this virtual event.

Dr. Sisson will share insights from *Relinquished* that illustrate birth mothers' reproductive decision-making, their life-long experiences of adoption, and why these stories matter for us in Ohio.
