Pet-Friendly Sunday Schmooze available outside and a no-pet option in Cathedral Hall.




No matter where you Schmooze, it is open for all ages. Children can also bring stuffed animals for a blessing, for those with allergies and those who don't have pets at home.



A Conversation with Dr. Gretchen Sisson, Ph.D. Relinquished: The Politics of Adoption and the Privilege of American Motherhood, October 30, 7:30 - 8:30 p.m., Virtual

In a political moment in Ohio where adoption is often invoked as an abortion alternative, what can we learn from the experiences of women who have relinquished children for adoption? <u>Adoption Network Cleveland</u> is pleased to host sociologist Gretchen Sisson, Ph.D. for a special preview of her upcoming book, *Relinquished: The Politics of Adoption and the Privilege of American Motherhood (Macmillian, February 2024)*, and Trinity Cathedral is proud to be a partner in this virtual event.

Dr. Sisson will share insights from *Relinquished* that illustrate birth mothers' reproductive decision-making, their life-long experiences of adoption, and why these stories matter for us in Ohio.
